From the Principal

These days we are being bombarded with information lurching toward rhetoric from central Government that there is a one size fits all approach to education and kids need to just be taught properly with some standardised programmes to reach their educational potential, find fulfilling and meaningful jobs and, by natural process, fix the flagging economy.

With 23 years in education I feel I can challenge many of those assertions but the ability to act is all but taken away by legislation and policy. As a school leader I just want what is best for our children, taking into account that no two children are the same, each has individual learning needs and our mission is to do our best to meet them.

Occasionally though, we get lucky and last week Minister Stanford released the content of the new curriculum in Maths. One of the Government's mandated programmes that schools can choose is PR1ME Maths. Luckily, here at Gordonton, we have been using PR1ME for 6 years and it is not only well embedded in our curriculum but also, we have adjusted the settings slightly to best serve the learning needs of our students. While many NZ schools will be scrambling to firstly decide and then implement a whole new programme, we can keep on going in the same direction with little or no impact on our staff and students.









Another programme offered is Numicon. Another resource we have been using for some time to support our littlest learners to build a strong foundation in number and to supplement our Maths programmes for those who require extra support.

I'm confident our Structured Literacy programme will share the same goodwill and it will be business as usual for us here at Gordonton. I feel for those schools having to navigate quantum change - especially those who were using systems that were working well for their Tamariki. In this case it seems though, we are not one of them.

If you want to see an example of how country schools find and celebrate their points of difference, look no further than Ag Day. Ours was held here on Friday last week and Emma and her team stitched

together a fabulous day of calves, lambs and goats as well as sand saucers, flower arrangements, decorated gumboots, cakes and fun. It was a perfect day and well attended by the community and guests. The kids were fabulous and the competition was fierce. Many thanks to the organisers, sponsors, judges, community and kids. Group day is happening as I write this.
