Labour day in New Zealand was brought into being in 1890 to originally celebrate the award of the 8 hour working day in 1840 to Wellington carpenter, Samuel Parnell, and was marked with union organised parades and marches where workers were allowed the day, or at least part of it, off to attend.



Over the years it has morphed into just another public holiday and the 'person on the street' will have little care of its origins. Its celebratory nature has also fallen victim to the need for people to have access to retail and hospitality services and successive neo-liberal governments have facilitated that access. he would make of the present nature of the day.


St John's Retirement Home
