Sadly, the new Government has again changed the way ERO goes about its evaluations and now we are going into the revised system. This visit is the precursor to a full ERO review in Week 4 of Term 4.



Reading data

Last week I shared the half yearly Maths Data with you. Here is the reading data captured in the school at the midpoint of the year. It is very encouraging, especially with the potential for more improvement before the end of year assessments.



We have 87.3% of our students across the school reading at or above their expected level. This is a great result for our students and teachers and I can vouch for the fact that everyone is working very hard to make further improvement to those already impressive results. Next week I will share the writing with you.

Next week of course we will be in the middle of production. It looks to be super exciting and I know the children are working extremely hard with their teachers, polishing their acts for your appreciation. So much work goes into one of these shows. Expect some very happy, but slightly sluggish children at the end of it - especially our smallest people.
